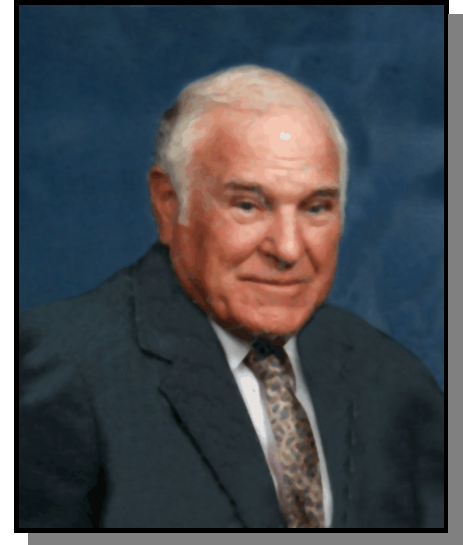

“Glenn Hopkins age 88 of Hamilton passed away in Hospice of Hamilton on Friday, May 8, 2009 at 11:58AM. He was born in Lily, Kentucky on February 8, 1921, the son of Garfield and Sarah (Wyrick) Hopkins. Glenn was a fifty-seven year member of the Princeton Pike Church of God; a member of the Golden Pikers; a Kentucky Colonel and was a veteran of the United States Army and Marine Corps in WWII serving with the 77th Infantry Division. He was employed as a mechanic for Avon Products for twenty years retiring in 1986. On July 2, 1949 in Hamilton, he was married to Mabel Center and she preceded him in death.

He is survived by one son; Randall (Sherry) Hopkins of Maineville, Ohio; one daughter, Michelle L. Hopkins of Hamilton; one brother, Bill (Natalie) Hopkins of Corbin, Kentucky and a grandson; Justin Rock.
