“JONES, Kendall B. of Springboro, passed away on Sat., 3/27 at the Dayton VA Medical Center. He was born on April 26, 1930 in Powell Co., KY to Lloyd C. & Bertha (Hatton) Jones.”



PFC Jones was a Korean War veteran while serving in the 1st Marine Division, U.S. Marine Corps. He enlisted in January 1952; was Wounded In Action September 1952; and was Honorably Discharged June 1953. A few of his military awards include the Purple Heart Medal, Korean Service Medal with 1 star, UN Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Navy Unit Citation and the Combat Action Ribbon.

“He worked in the Security Dept. for 30 years, retiring in 1982 from Armco Steel Co. Kendall was a member of the Tytus Ave. First Church of God and the D.A.V.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his brothers: Ray & Charles E. Jones and a sister; Lois Patton. He is survived by his wife of 62 years; Ora Jean Jones, his son; K. Douglas (Judy) Jones of Springboro, a daughter; Diane (Randell) Brewster of Middletown, 4 grandchildren: Corey & Casey Jones, Randy Brewster & Mandy Bunch, 4 great-grandchildren; Alyssa, Dillon & Cadence Bunch and Kailey Brewster and his brother; Levaughn D.
