“MCCULLEY, Floyd A. Lindsey. Dear father of Jonathan A. David McCulley. Survived by 6 brothers, 3 sisters, 1 deceased sister, numerous nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews and great, great nieces and nephews.

Also survived by numerous dear friends and best buddy Bosco. Monday, January 17, 2011, age 62 years.

Relatives and friends are invited to attend a memorial mass at St. John the Evangelist Church 7121 Plainfield Rd. (Deer Park) on Tuesday at 11 AM. Visitation at the church from 10am until Mass at 11am

He was a member of the Khe Sanh Vietnam Veterans group. Interment at Dayton National Veteran's Cemetery at 3 P.M. Tuesday. “

On 27 July 1966, at the young age of 17 years and 8 months, Floyd enlisted as a Private into the U.S. Marine Corps in Cincinnati, Ohio. Before turning 21 years of age, Floyd was Honorably released from active duty on 8 August 1969 at Camp Lejeune, NC. As a combat Marine, he would rise to the rank of Corporal and serve as a 0341 Mortarman and Rifleman.



Fellow Marine Dan Fisher, who served 7 months with Floyd at Khe Sanh wrote “Floyd McCulley served in Vietnam as a rifleman with 1st Platoon, Company “D”, 1st Battalion, 26th Marines, 3rd Marine Division (reinforced) for 2 tours in 1967 - 1968. Floyd saw action at Hill 55, west of DaNang, at Khe Sanh, including the 77 day “Siege” and again at Hill 55 area in later 1968. Floyd was well respected and known by his fellow Marines as “Short Round”. Floyd was a member of Khe Sanh Veterans, Inc. and the Delta Co. 1/26 Association.” Khe Sanh Veterans: www.khesanh.org

His last duty assignment was with Company “C”, 1st Battalion, 2nd Marines, 2nd Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force. During his 3 plus years of active service, 2 years and 1 month was served overseas as a combat Marine in Vietnam. His Awards and decorations include the Combat Action Ribbon, Presidential Unit Citation, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and the Vietnam Campaign Medal. He also qualified as a Marksman with the Rifle and Pistol.
