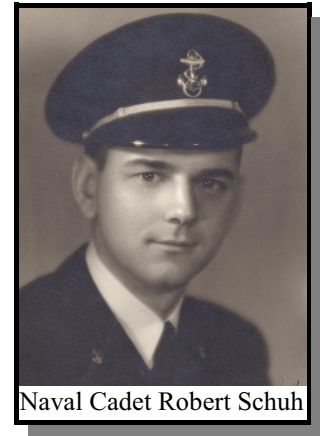

**ROBERT KORB SCHUH
MAJOR (ret) U.S. MARINE CORPS
WORLD WAR II and Korean War**



“Robert K. Schuh, Sr. age 90 of Lebanon, Ohio passed peacefully Saturday morning, February 11, 2012 at the Otterbein Retirement Community with his family by his side.

Born May 27, 1921 in Newport, Kentucky, Robert was the son of Dominic J. and Marguerite (Thorman) Schuh and a proud U.S. Marine Corps. Veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict.

Robert was a retired sales agent with General Advertising in Cincinnati and a loving husband, father and grandfather. Preceded in death by his parents, Robert is survived by his loving wife Anna (Wise) Schuh of Lebanon, Ohio; sons Robert, Jr. of Loveland, Ohio, David of Blue Ash, Ohio and John of Mason, Ohio; daughter Carol Runyan of Franklin, Ohio; sister Peggy Horn of Kentucky; twelve grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.”

Robert enlisted as a Private into the U.S. Marine Corps 23 December 1942 and was subsequently discharged as a First Lieutenant on 11 March 1946. After boot camp he transferred to the U.S. Navy and attended Iowa Pre-flight School, Iowa City, IA where he was trained in the Military Occupational Specialty of Instrument Flight Instructor. Following flight school he returned to the U.S. Marine Corps as a 2nd Lieutenant. He was subsequently stationed at the United States Naval Air Station (NAS), Hutchinson, KS; at the US NAS, Corpus Christi, TX; at the US NAS, Atlanta, GA; at the US NAS, Corpus Christi, TX; at the US NAS, Jacksonville, FL; and at the US NAS, Miami, FL. Following World War II, Robert was separated from active military service in March 1946 as a First Lieutenant, U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.



Robert was re-activated for the Korean War and sent to Korea from 1952 through 1953. While in Korea, he flew air patrols, and volunteered in the Korean Orphanages. Robert was discharged in 1953 as a Major, U.S. Marine Corps Reserve.

For his military service, Robert received the following medals and awards: Marine Corps Presidential Unit Citation; the American Campaign Medal; the World War II Victory Medal; the National Defense Service Medal; the Korean Service Medal (with 2 Bronze Stars); the US Marine Corps Reserve Medal; and the UN Korean Service Medal.

Marines from **The Chosin Reservoir Detachment 968** rendered honors as casket guards during the funeral visitation period. The detail consisted of Commandant John Tonkin, Robert Collier and Robert Bell.
